A credit hour is defined as an amount of work represented in intended learning outcomes and verified by evidence of student achievement not less than one hour of classroom or direct faculty instruction and a minimum of two hours of student work outside of class each week for one semester or the equivalent number of hours for shorter sessions (e.g. summer); or an equivalent amount of work for other academic activities as established by the institution including laboratory work, internships, practica, studio work, and other academic work leading to the award of credit hours. Instruction and out of class work increase commensurately for courses consisting of more credit hours.									
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Institutional Recording Policies: All courses attempted are recorded, except courses dropped in the first two weeks of the term and all courses in which the student was enrolled at the time of voluntary withdrawal from the University.
